Cycle Advocacy

As mentioned in the February Newsletter, **HUB** (formerly the Greater Vancouver Cycling Coalition) has a subcommittee that is working on cycling improvement initiatives in South Surrey – White Rock. Several of us (Chris Hodgson, Andy Bacon, Neil McNeill, Clark Woodland) have attended their meetings which led to a HUB-organized meeting with representatives from the City of Surrey, Translink and the provincial Ministry of Transportation (who are responsible for highways (e.g., 99 and 15) and bridges that cross them. The meeting was useful and informative for all parties and, we anticipate that it will lead to similar meetings in the future.

As mentioned in the February Newsletter, we are also coordinating our advocacy efforts with the White Rock 0-5-0 Club.
