Information for Ride Leaders NEW Changes for Communicating Ride Information

Completing the Ride Schedule

Leaders go to the Ride Schedule on Google Drive and input ride information for rides they propose to lead. The FV Chapter Ride Coordinator (RC) transfers this information to the FV section of the CCCTS

website.

Leaders no longer post ride information on Google Drive. Instead, they email the following Leaders no longer post rice information on Google Unive, instead, they email the tolowing information to the RC at postmaster fraser@cccts.org. The RC will post ride information on the CCCTS website.

Ride Name
Leader - Name, email address and cell phone number

- Starting Point and Start time
- Nexus or Passport Yes or No

Lunch Stop - Location
Kide Directions/Map - Include 'Ride with GPS' link or attach a pdf file with info.

If Leaders want to book a date to lead a ride but haven't finalized all of the ride details, they should send the information they have to the RC with the remaining ride details provided at least

a week prior to the ride.

* Implement this change immediately. Leaders are asked to send ride information for any new rides they propose to lead directly to the RC rather than entering it on Google Drive.




A new bike unit has already paid dividends for the Delta police.




