HUB Cycling is a charitable not-for-profit organization that has spent over 20 years removing barriers to cycling in Metro Vancouver, while cultivating the health, environmental and economic benefits that active transportation can bring. HUB has educated thousands of people, motivated thousands more and championed improvements such as **#UnGapTheMap** to create a cycling network.

HUB Cycling has close to 3,000 members and more than 65,000 direct supporters.
