MINUTES

1. Approve Minutes of October 2nd meeting

Moved by Edward, seconded by David. Approved.

2. Old Business

a) **AGM**

Edward confirmed the room reservation and menu arrangements for the Roadhouse Grill (1781 King George Blvd.).

The Atrium room can accommodate up to 40 people. Room is booked from 11 am to 2:30 pm, but at the moment, the room is available after that.

The meeting will begin at 11 am and the guest speaker (Tobin Copley, Injury Prevention Lead at Fraser Health) will speak after the meeting is brought to order and the Minutes of the 2022 AGM are approved (11:15 or so).

Clark will send out the Notice of Meeting to members and request that members planning to attend RSVP to give us an idea of the attendance.

We will have a draw to award door prizes. Edward will buy a roll of tickets to be used for the draw. Several bike stores have been/will be approached re. contributing door prizes. Clark has 6 pairs of cycling glasses from last year's AGM.

b) CPR and first aid training

Edward reported that his contact, Trevor White, has changed employers and that may affect his timing/availability to do the training as initially planned for January and his access to materials he would use. The current plan is still to:

- have a 7-hour course (2 hours CPR, 5 hours basic first aid),
- have 20 25 participants and invite 0-5-0 members if spaces are available, and
- charge participants \$15.

- Turnbull Room (full room or half room depending on the number of participants) at the South Surrey Rec. Centre; or
- White Rock Culture and Recreation facilities.

Funding may be available from CCCTS. Edward has approached the Board about the funding application process.

3. New Business

a) Advocacy Subcommittee Report

Edward, John and Neil were unable to attend the HUB meeting on October 19th where local First Nations made a presentation on and sought support from HUB for the local Great Blue Heron Way. A system of trails that would connect local First Nations and be integrated with the Trans Canada Trail. Edward will send minutes from the meeting to Clark for circulation to SC members.

b) Communications Report

Clark reported that the October Newsletter was sent out.

The next Newsletter will be later in November with information on the AGM, the winter ride program, a membership renewal reminder and an invitation to serve on the Steering Committee. Information on the proposed First Aid course and Hub and Spoke will be deferred to a future Newsletter when there are more specific details.

c) Finance Report as of October 31st

- She is currently recruiting leaders for those rides & will populate the events calendar with those leaders as they become available
- The attendance for these rides will be posted in the calendar similar to the Wednesday rides
- Emails will no longer be sent to the membership to advertise these rides

f) Social Subcommittee Report

The next social event will be the lunch at the AGM on December 14th.

g) FV Chapter Survey

There was general agreement that the proposed survey as designed should proceed. Edward will post the survey on Survey Monkey and will offer two draw prizes to encourage participation.

h) "Death of a Member" & "Injured Member" policies

Clark proposed the following minor change (highlighted in yellow) to the current policy.

In the event of the death of a CCCTS Club Member, the Executive will work with the Social Sub Committee to send "an Orchid and a card" ASAP to the Family.

Should a non member Spouse/Partner pass, then a card will be sent to the family.

At this point, the club will only acknowledge for a death & not for an injury of a rider.
